Date of next Brizlincote Parish Litter Pick...volunteers welcome

Brizlincote Parish Council intend to hold another litter pick, on Saturday 21st September, meeting outside the Violet Way Academy gates at 10am. The litter pick will concentrate on nearby woodland walks.

The first Brizlincote Parish Litter Pick was held on Saturday 20th July. The collecting of roadside litter was carried out along Violet Way, up Grafton Road and towards Tesco. The volunteers collected a number of bags of litter which included bottles, drink cans, pens, clothing, cardboard, newspaper and in the parking spaces outside Violet Way Academy a very large number of cigarette butts!

Some fly tipping was identified on the slope off Grafton Road, which ESBC Cllr Peters arranged to have removed by East Staffordshire Borough Council. For further information on our litter picking scheme please contact Cllr Adrian Cowan on 01283 530472.

A step in the right direction! The steep path from Leander Rise down to the Redwoods has been upgraded with the introduction of some new shallow steps (pictured below). Brizlincote Parish Council would like to thank Trudi Joyce of ESBC for managing this successful project.



In September ESBC contractors will resume the project to reduce the height of overgrown hedges around the parish. Contractors must wait for the bird nesting season to end (March to August) before they can begin. It is an offence under Section 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act of 1981 to intentionally take, damage or destroy the nest of any wild bird while it is in use or being built.

Householders are urged to check that their hedges and trees have not overgrown onto pavements & roads causing an obstruction, and if it is necessary please trim the foliage back. Thanks.

Council Barking Mad after theft of signs



Following the introduction of Dog Orders within the Brizlincote Parish, Brizlincote Parish Council was required to fix *'Dogs must be kept on a lead in this area'* signs at the entrances to Tower Woods, Clifton Way Open space, and the bridleway behind Jasmine Close. Sadly some vandals have been removing signs as soon as they have been fixed. We have now been informed by ESBC that Brizlincote Parish Council will have to purchase any additional signs they require to replace stolen ones!

Community Speed Watch Update

Recent speed checks on Violet Way have uncovered a disturbing amount of motorists still exceeding the 30 mph speed limit.

July 27th: 234 vehicles were checked over a period of one hour with 32 exceeding 36 mph. 45 mph was the highest speed recorded.

August 2nd: 191 vehicles were checked over a period of one hour with 21 exceeding 36 mph. 41 mph was the highest speed recorded.

A speeding motor bike was clocked at 58 mph 0n Violet Way!

Light at the end of the tunnel: There is 'light at the end of the tunnel' with regard to ongoing parking problems near to schools on Violet Way. ClIrs Bernard Peters (ESBC) and Conor Wileman (SCC) led the debate at a recent Borough Council Joint Parking Committee meeting on the parking problems on Violet Lane and junctions near to Violet Lane Academy, resulting in the committee adding the issues to its list of priority works. The traffic and parking problems in Violet Way will be risk assessed and evaluated by the SCC highways team who will report on its findings at the next Joint Parking Committee meeting in October. Once traffic regulation orders are approved, it will allow enforcement teams from ESBC to exercise powers and issue fixed penalty notices in a greater and wider area closer to the Violet Way Academy. There will also be the implementation of double yellow lines at road junctions to end to the problem of dangerous parking on junctions.

Longer term realistic plans are also being drawn up: Cllr Conor Wileman has asked Staffordshire County Council to look into setting up a stopping point at the Paulet School, which would allow parents to park off the road when they drop off and pick up and children heading to both the Paulet School and Violet Way Academy. If the plans went ahead, a new roundabout would be installed on Violet Way at the junction with Paulet School. The junction would be widened with the use of a slip road. Activity in the car park could be monitored by staff at the schools. The idea behind the proposal has been welcomed by both schools, but that the solution would have to work for everybody. Cllrs Bernard Peters & Conor Wileman would like your feedback on the ideas...*PLEASE CONTACT THEM* with your comments.

Focus on the problem: CIIr Jake Fellows has come up with a snappy way to report problems around the parish by encouraging residents discovering a problem to provide photographic evidence, so that the local councillors can focus on the issues reported promptly. If you see any parking, landscaping, dog fouling or litter issues around Brizlincote; take a photo and email it to the <u>clerk@brizlincote-pc.org.uk</u>, informing them of the date, location and problem. The Parish Council will then forward the information to CIIrs Jake Fellows & Bernard Peters; who will contact the relevant authority after viewing the photographs to rectify the problem.

Feedback Required: Cllrs Jake Fellows & Bernard Peters would like any feedback you have relating to the improvement works undertaken to Stapenhill Road/Spring Terrace Road junction, especially the latest proposal to make it a no right turn into Stapenhill Road from Spring Terrace Road.
