# Now the Bad News... Vandals Set Fire to Tower Woods Play Area



ESBC invested a total of £35,000 to improve the Tower Woods Play Area last year, and vandals have caused £3,000 worth of damage to a large number of wooden retaining posts, stepping blocks and balance beams, and a large area of bark chippings.

Investigations by fire investigators and Staffordshire Police have discovered the fire was a 'deliberate act' and are searching for those responsible.

# Are We The Fools? by Councillor Jim Muir

Are you like me, fed up with high energy bills, not because of a wasteful nature and failure to obtain the best tariff, but because of the way the supplier treats you. I found that at the end of each year my supplier advised me that I was in credit. Not by a few pounds but often by several hundred pounds. Yet still they attempted to increase my monthly direct debit. If you're in the same boat I suggest that you contact your supplier and in the first instance instruct the company to maintain or reduce your payments, and advise that if there is a shortfall at the end of the year you will settle your



bill then. I have a friend who asked the amount that she was in credit at year end to be refunded to her bank account. She had a real tussle but in the end got her money back. Think of it this way, when the big power companies announce their monster profits ask yourself how much is made up of interest on *your* money in *their* bank!

I have also been annoyed lately by e-mails instructing me to submit my meter readings. This may be no big thing, but it does involve my completing work on behalf of the energy provider, and I think it only fair that I'm paid for doing it. I have accordingly advised the company that I shall be invoicing them for the time taken. I've said that my fees are £80 and hour and have apportioned 10 minutes for reading an outside gas meter and 5 minutes for an indoor electricity meter. I will therefore submit an invoice to the sum of £20 should they continue to require that I complete these tasks. Alternatively they can ask one of their operatives to do it on their behalf. I await their response.
