


Introducing your new Brizlincote Parish Councillors



Paul Presley-Brooks (chairman): I live with my wife Moira in Brizlincote Lane. I worked on the investment division of a large local brewery until the time this was closed down. SCC Councillor Conor Wileman's Update

Speed Appraisal: Having received a number of emails relating to speeding on Brizlincote valley and more specifically the bend near Hargate Road and Ashworth Avenue, money has been set aside to increase visibility of signage in the vicinity. This will include a larger and better located sign warning of the off camber bend, chevrons to warn drivers of the danger and more speed checks along the road to understand whether the problem is increasing. If so further measures will be looked at.

Solar Farm Brizlincote Lane: I am very concerned with proposals from Sun Edison to use Brizlincote Lane as the access to build a solar farm. The planning application has not been submitted but it is likely the developer will opt to use Brizlincote Lane as the access point. I would welcome any resident to contact me about their concerns so we can address the application if it is submitted.

Highways team: Staffordshire County Council funds a highways team to do a general tidy of the area every year. They will be in our area over the next couple of weeks and will tackle some overgrown shrubs and weeding to make the area a tidy place to live.
