Defibrillator

We are very pleased to announce the installation of a community use defibrillator at Tesco Express, Best Avenue as an easily accessible and relatively high footfall location.

Working with the Community Heartbeat Trust, the Council have funded an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) which is very easy for anyone to use, giving both verbal and diagrammatic instructions on-screen.

Defibrillation within 3–5 min of collapse can produce survival rates as high as 50–70%. This can be achieved through public access defibrillation and when a bystander uses a nearby AED (Automated External Defibrillator) to deliver the first shock. Each minute of delay to defibrillation reduces the probability of survival to hospital discharge by 10% so every minute is vital in ensuring that the patient is given every chance of leaving hospital.


The Council is very grateful for the help of a key group of staff at Tesco Express and a small group of volunteers who will be undertaking the required weekly checks of the unit to ensure the continued "fit for purpose" is maintained.

A free Public Awareness Session will be held (date and time to be confirmed) where the demonstration of the use of the defibrillator, explanation how the equipment works and its benefits to the community will be covered. Everyone is welcome, no specials skills or experience is required, just a willingness to play an important role in the event of a medical emergency.

neighbouring Stapenhill. We have a busy life enjoying time with our grandchildren, family, pets and friends.


