4/18-11-21 **Chairs report –** no separate report was presented.

5/18-11-21 Report by County, Borough Councillors and

Staffordshire Police reports

Staffordshire Police confirmed that most of the items reported

were parking issues.

Borough Cllr Wileman noted that litter had increased in key

areas within the parish.

Borough Cllr Peters report was noted. He advised council that the Community and Civil Enforcement team conducted a

focused 4 day initiative in the Brizlincote ward area.

Some issues raised where litter around schools and

Brizlincote Nature Trail and also irresponsible dog owners

not picking up their dogs foul.

County Cllr Wileman confirmed that he was still awaiting the audit findings for Beaufort Road/Violet Way/Grafton Road junction. He confirmed that he is still exploring the full width

speed hump project. Highways are considering the

proposals. Parking around Violet Way is still a concern. Staffordshire police and ESBC civil enforcement will be making several visits.

It was noted that County Cllr Wileman has been working closely with SCC network management to establish a better way of managing emergency works to prevent disruption on the local roads.

## 6/18-11-21 Highways - Speed restrictions for Violet Way, Beaufort Road

Cllr Cowan has had a meeting with Community Speed Watch. Speed watch near to Redwood Drive and Beaufort Road locations have been identified. We continue to wait highways update in relation to raised bumps.

Additional speed watch volunteers are always welcomed.

#### **7/18-11-21 Climate change**

There were concerns raised about lack of planning policy changes to support climate change. It was noted that legislation has to be passed.

a) Family Nature Walk

TTTV have now carried out a tree survey in the area. Interpretation board, picnic tables and rubbing posts will be installed week commencing Monday, 22<sup>nd</sup> November.

b) (Christmas) tree canopy update
